Following Instructions

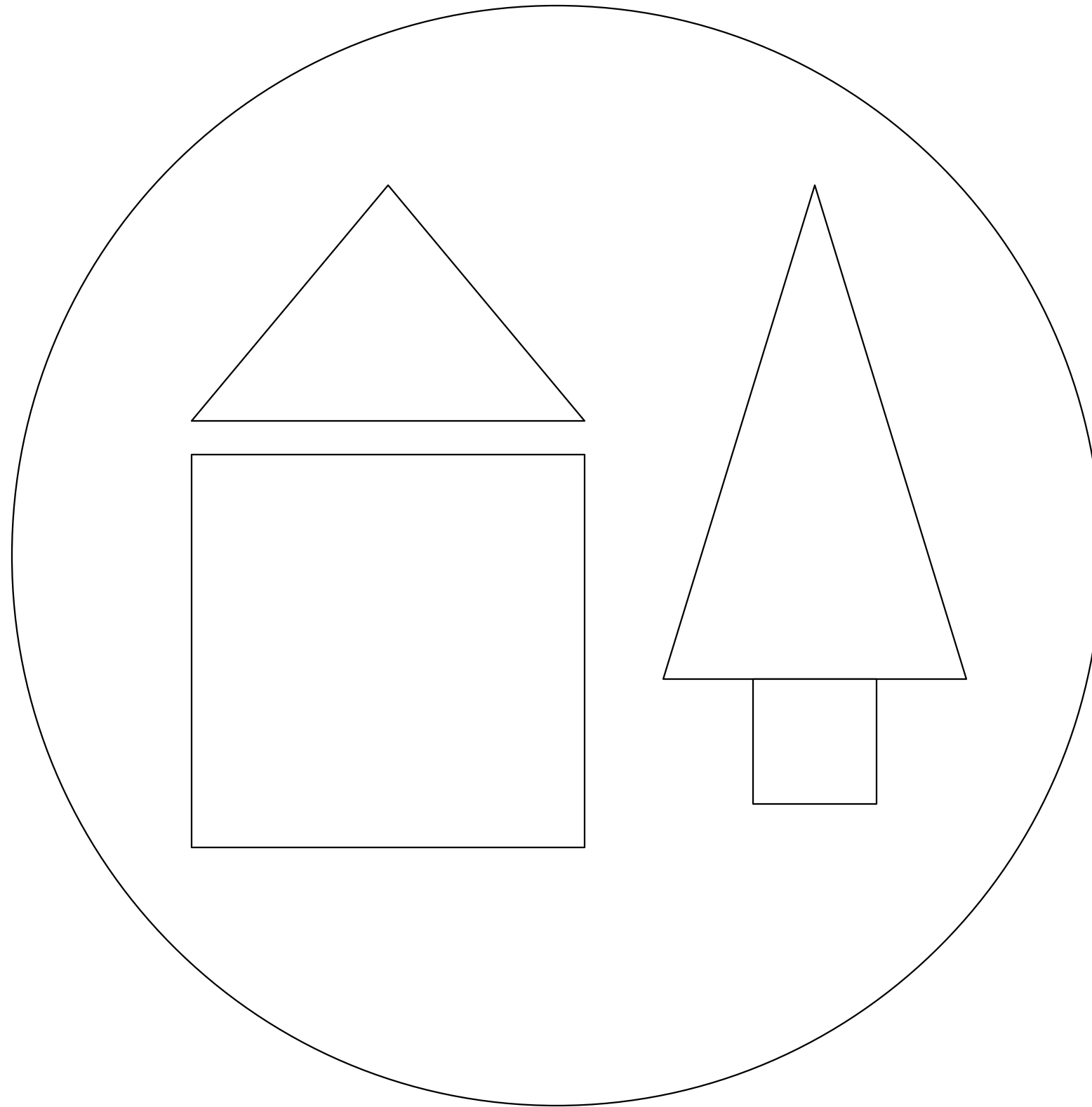

- **Draw a circle around everything such that all the shapes are inside it.**

If you have followed the instructions, this is how it should look

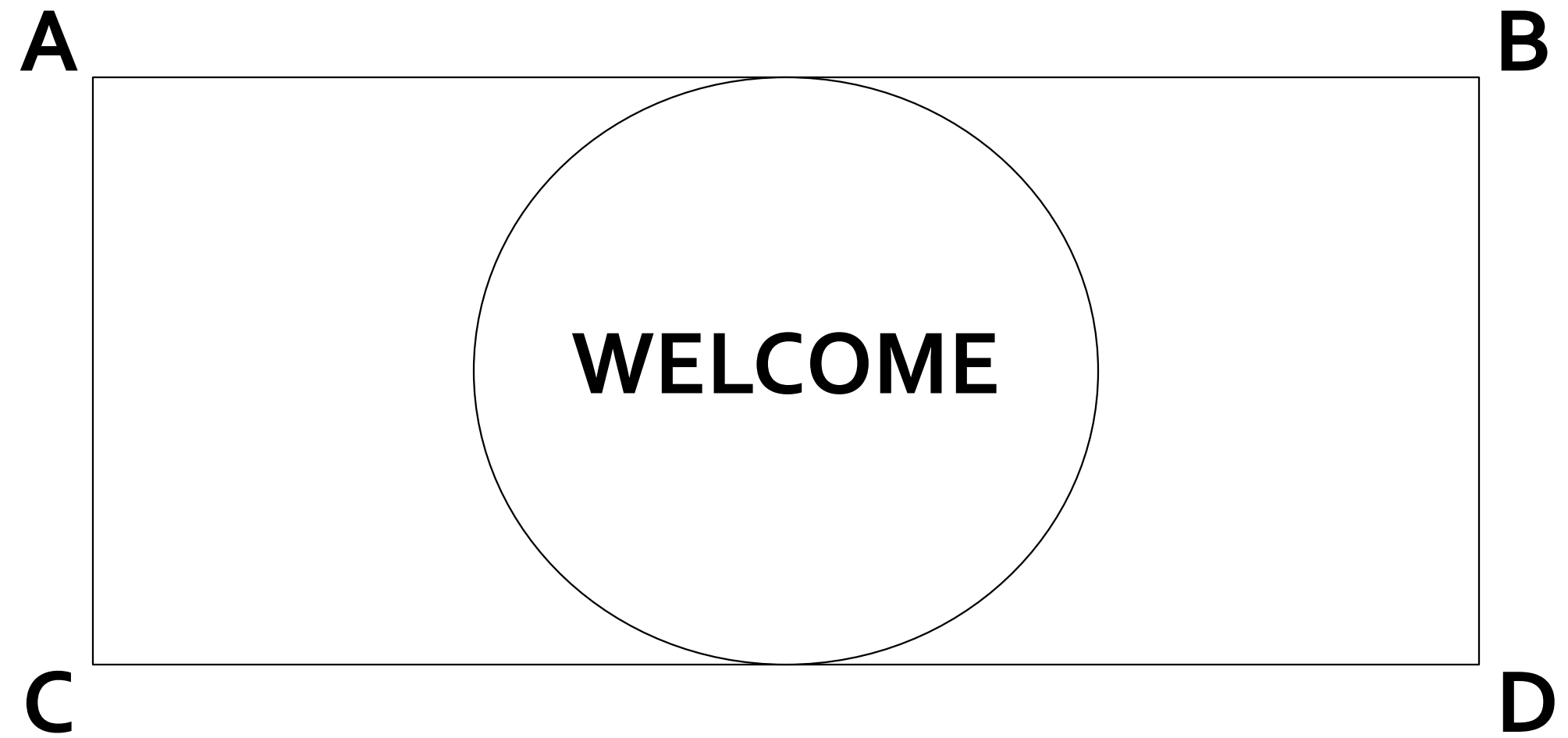


Let's try again.

Let's Make a Paper Airplane!

Materials:

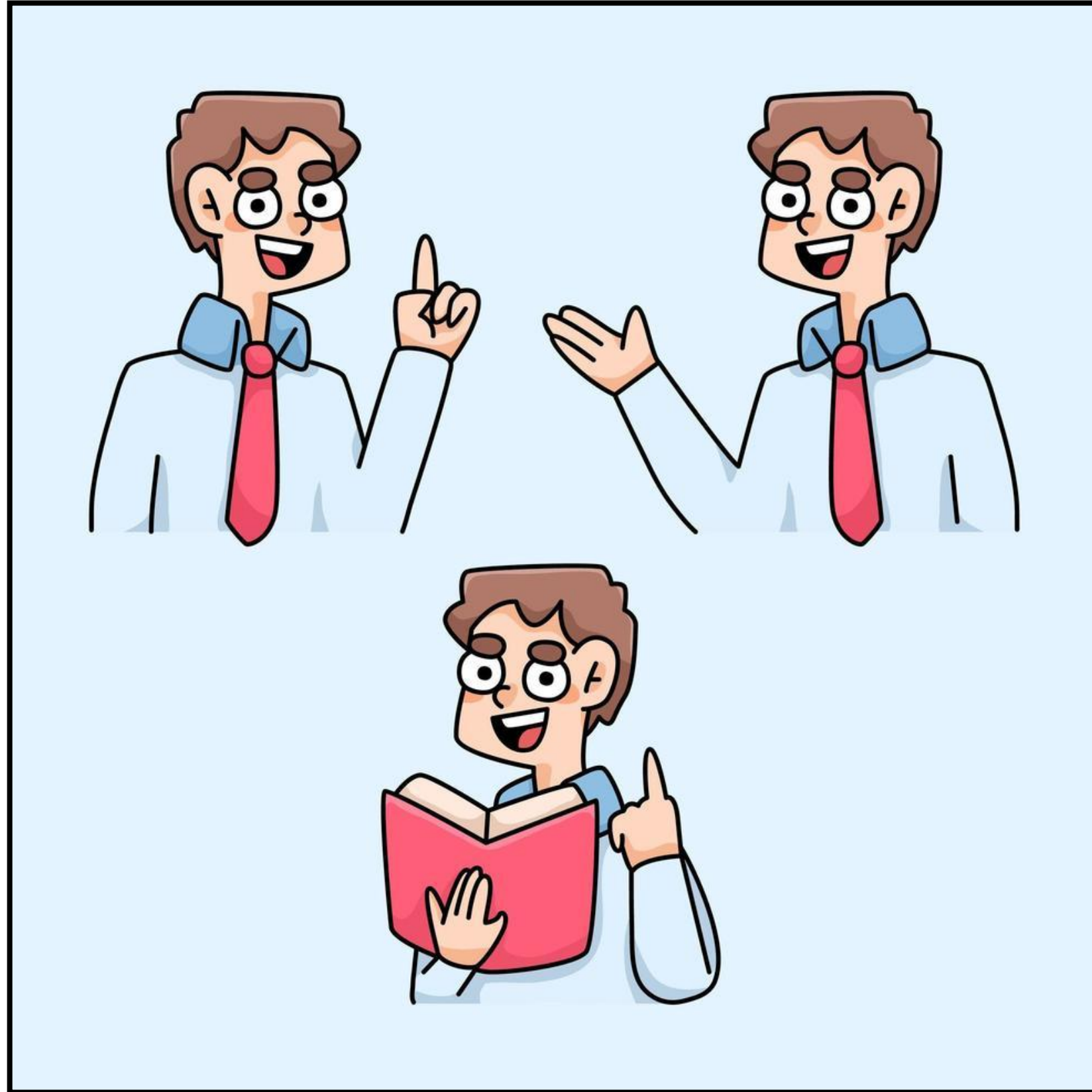
A standard sheet of paper

Instructions:

1. Fold the paper in half lengthwise, creating a long rectangle. Unfold the paper.
2. Fold the top corners of the paper down to meet the center crease.
3. Bend each of the triangular flaps toward the middle to sharpen the point.
4. Fold the paper in half along the vertical crease.
5. Fold the top edges downward to form the wings.

Your paper airplane is ready to fly!
